## Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Antiphons and Readings

**Entrance Antiphon:** All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, and shall sing to you, shall sing to your name, O Most High!

**First reading.:** **Isaiah 62:1-5** For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch. The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings your glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the LORD will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the LORD delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you.

**Responsorial Psalm: 96(95):1-2a. 2b-3. 7-8a. 9-10ac. R3**

**Response:** Proclaim the wonders of the Lord among all the peoples..

**Second reading: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11** Brothers and Sisters: There are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For to one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the ability to distinguish between spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are empowered by one and the same Spirit, who apportions to each one individually as he wills.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia. God called us through the gospel, so that we may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia.

**Gospel: John 2:1-11** At that time: There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding seventy or one hundred litres. Jesus said to the servants, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, 'Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast.' So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now.' This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

**Communion Antiphon:** You have prepared a table before me, and how precious is the chalice that quenches my thirst.

## Safeguarding Training

We are having a Safeguarding Training Day led by Rob Kingdon, from the Diocesan Safeguarding Team, in the Parish Hall at Most Holy Trinity on Saturday 1st March (timings yet to be confirmed) Refreshments and lunch will be provided.

Training is mandatory for any volunteers in ministry that requires a DBS, including all Eucharistic Ministers (Level 1).

All parishioners who have had their DBS's processed, either new or a recheck, have been sent out the link to the Catholic Safeguarding training (LMS), and have been asked to complete the Volunteer Level 3 Module. All volunteers who haven't completed this training online will need to attend the training on 1st March at Most Holy Trinity to enable them to continue to volunteer in ministry.

## Saint of the week

### St Wulfstan II, Bishop Of Worcester

Born in Warwickshire to parents who embraced monasticism in later life, St Wulfstan II was an English Benedictine monk who served as Bishop of Worcester, and was even a founding monk of Worcester Cathedral. He was noted for his dedication and chastity and attributed to the miracle of healing King Harold's daughter. He was also a strong reformer between old and new regimes and alleviating suffering of the poor. He helped end the slave trade from Bristol. He is the patron saint of vegetarians because of abstaining from meat after being distracted from devotions due to the smell of his favourite meal, roast goose.
