The incarnation is the most extraordinary, mind-dazzling, significant and fascinating event

in human history. It has fired the imagination of artists of every kind. Poets, sculptors, writers, and biblical experts have used striking imagery to this unimaginable into truth human language. They've spoken of it as "a divine kiss of peace", an "explosion of

"explosion of God's extraordinary love for us", a "fresh bond of intimacy" between God and humanity,

between the mighty God and God's tiny creatures. At the heart of this astonishing story stands a woman who is totally one with us in our humanity.

The annunciation uniquely focuses, not upon a great man, such as a general, a politician or a renowned scholar, but upon a

John's Gospel records that when Philip, one of Jesus' first disciples, was told that the longawaited Messiah had come and was living in Nazareth, his cool reaction was, "What good ever came from Nazareth?"

The story of the annunciation begins with the arrival of an unexpected visitor at Mary's little cottage. An angel, the bearer of startling news, reveals that she is to conceive, carry in her womb, give birth and finally be mother to the long-awaited Messiah.
